POSTGRADUATE TEACHING APPRENTICESHIP

A successful school is dependent on the skills, aptitude and enthusiasm of the whole staff team. It is key that all employees have the opportunity to develop and support pupils to achieve their full potential. Are you ready to take the next step and qualify as a teacher? If so Star Institute Teacher Apprenticeship can provide an outstanding pathway to QTS.

Star Institute School Centred Postgraduate Apprenticeship is a qualification aimed at staff already working in education who aspire to become a teacher. This pathway will enable you to work full-time whilst you train to become a teacher.



WHO IS THE PROGRAMME FOR?

The Postgraduate Teaching Apprenticeship is an attractive option for school employees (e.g. HLTAs) to become qualified teachers.

The programme leads to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) with the optional award of a PGcert at Masters' level. Apprentices can specialise in primary (3-7) or (5-11) or a specific subject at secondary level (11-16). Star Teachers currently offers the following secondary subjects: mathematics, physics, biology, chemistry, English, history, geography, modern foreign languages, computer science and religious education.

PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

The Postgraduate Apprenticeship enables you to continue to work in your school whilst training to become a teacher. You will be released each Friday to engage in centre-based training and will complete a contrasting six-week placement in the Spring term. At Star Institute, we understand what outstanding teaching looks like and how to help teachers get there whatever their starting point. Star Teachers Postgraduate Apprenticeship programme has been built to offer:

- Personalisation and progression - a tailored programme designed to systematically develop your pedagogical toolkit

- Career pathway planning - personalised support to secure employment and begin a journey of continuous professional development.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Postgraduate Apprentices must have support from their employing school. You must possess a good degree (**typically** 2.2 or above). For secondary apprentices, this should **normally** be relevant to the subject you wish to teach, but A-level subjects in your chosen area will be considered. Subject Knowledge Enhancement courses are available. You will need level 4 (formally grade C) or above in GCSE English and mathematics. Primary teacher apprentices will also need a level 4 or above in GCSE science. GCSE equivalencies will be considered but these need to be confirmed against the ESFA agreed list of qualifications.

DURATION

The Postgraduate Teaching Apprenticeship is completed over four terms. The apprenticeship will commence in July 2021 and the apprentice will work and train towards gaining QTS in July of the following year. The teacher will continue to develop as an NQT in term four when a final apprenticeship assessment will take place.

APPLY

Applications to Star Teachers Postgraduate Apprenticeship are made through the UCAS Teacher Training portal or DfE Apply.

COSTS

The cost of the programme can be covered by the apprenticeship levy, if your employing school is eligible. The apprentice should be paid on UQ1 for the duration of first three terms and M1 for the final term. The additional cost of the PGCert would need to be funded by the school or the apprentice.
